
Prejudice

Cultural Diversity



Human Library addresses misinterpretation and misunderstanding among cultural groups (Yap, Labangon, & Cajes, 2017).



Human Library

Venue for dialogue among those stereotyped, judged, oppressed and discriminated against (Yap, 2020).

Started in Denmark in 2000.





Human Library

Lessen existing forms of stereotyping and branding (Yap & Labangon, 2018)

The program's ultimate vision is to empower people to accept themselves and let others view those who are prejudiced with tolerance and understanding (Yap & Labangon, 2015)



Shared safe place for all. A venue for truthful conversation pieces – making the library an indispensable learning opportunity for everyone.

Human Library Experience: Organizers



Build a Committed Team

Gather team members who are open-minded and are willing to change the world for a better place.

Be positive

Because of its sensitivity, the team must be prepared for all the challenges. The team must convince themselves first before embarking on the ideals of the campaign. It is time to end prejudice.




Human Books

Based on prevalent prejudices existing in the community. Survey may be used to identify a list.

Scouting or searching of volunteers is quite challenging.

You may ask to sign a volunteer agreement.





Summary of the human books. Our human books vary with every session and we strive to provide a diverse selection to our readers. In the course of our implementation of this program, we have classified the prejudices in the following:

- Physical traits. e.g. person with tattoo, overweight, underweight; person with physical deformities, blind, midget;
- Gender preference. e.g. lesbian, gays, bisexual and transgender;
- Profession. e.g. politician, policeman, banker, businesswoman, columnist, fitness teacher, lingerie model, young entrepreneur;
- 4) Religious belief/practice.e.g. atheist, Buddhist monk, Muslim, nun;
- Afflicted with disease. e.g. person living with HIV;
- 6) Distinct character.e.g. geek, person with third eye, vegetarian, animal lover; strict parent, social activist.




Readers

Pre-register or Walk-in (Yap & Labangon, 2015).

May ask unscripted questions to clarify things based on their views on the subject of the human book. They can personally ask questions and learn from a different perspective.



Five Sessions

At Nazarbayev University Library, Human Library events started in 2016, and the Library has hosted five of these activities.

Readers noted that the most important experiences they gained from this program included acknowledging the existence of these communities, understanding the difficulties biases can cause other people, and listening to wonderful stories that changed their perspectives.

The human library is a social movement that originated in Denmark in 2000. It addresses the issue of discrimination based on religion, ethnicity, political opinion, gender, sexual orientation and disability and aims to create an open dialogue where people can challenge their stereotypes.




