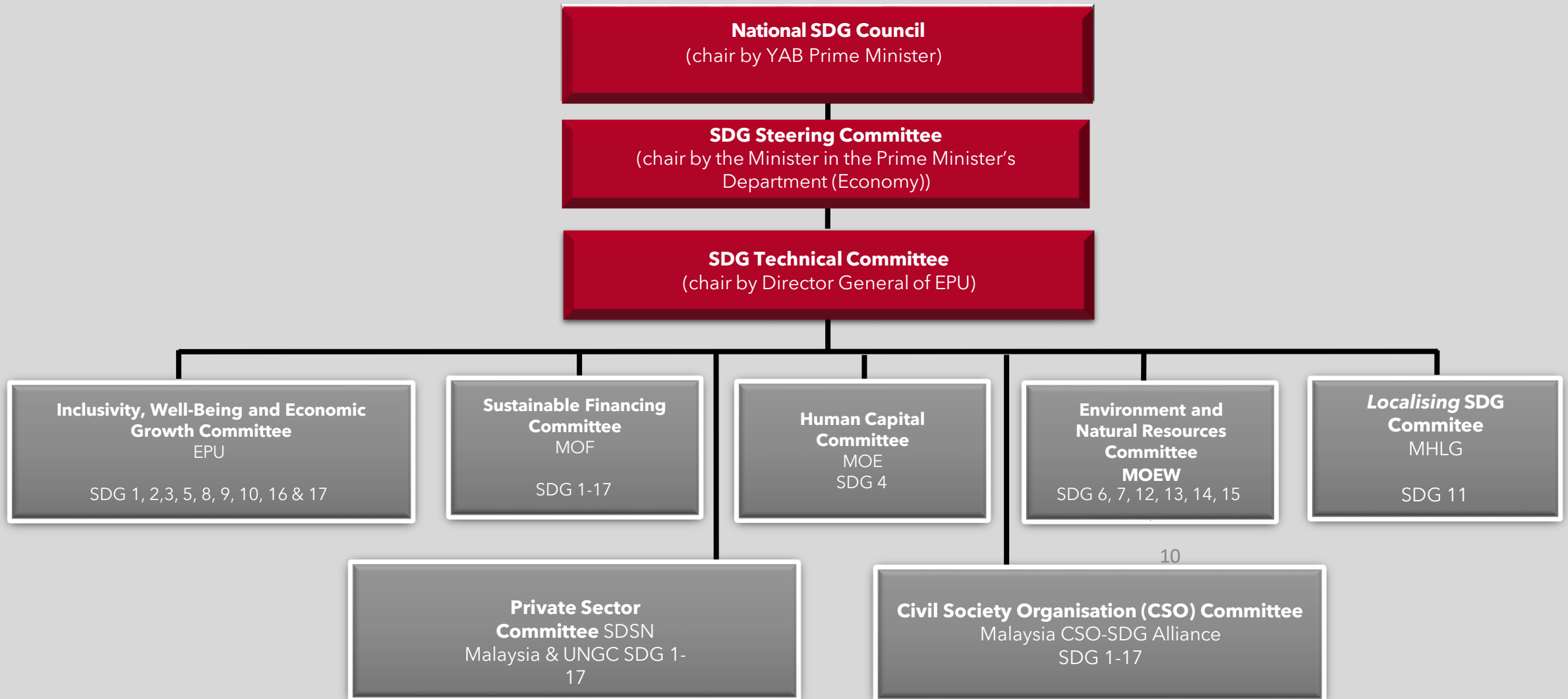

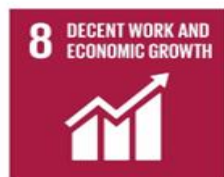

Throughout the years, MLG went through several name changes and in 1998, it was officially known as Persatuan Pustakawan Malaysia (PPM) or the Librarians Association of Malaysia. In September 2015, the world leaders who attended the UN Summit adopted the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) 2030. On 1 January 2016, all 17 SDGs officially came into force. Subsequently, the United Nations stated that:

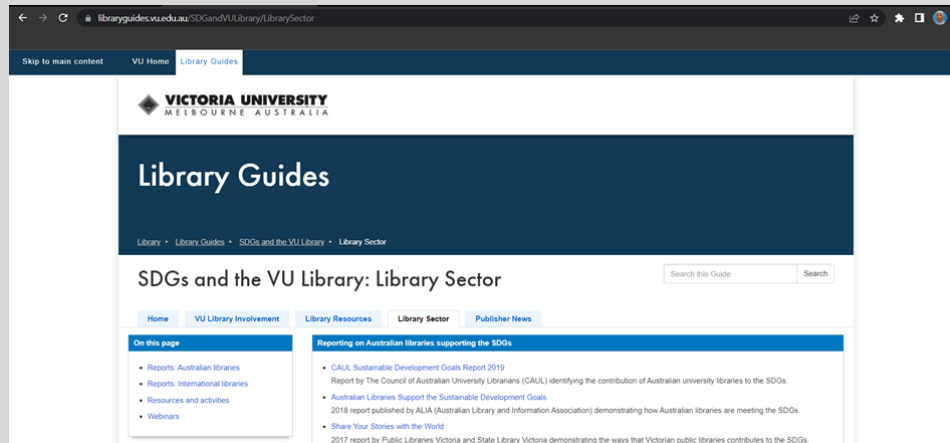
# Role of library association in SDGs?

# How to integrate?

- CEPA
  - Communication, Education, Public Awareness - enhance community's understanding of SDGs.
  - Inform the community about SDGs i.e. bring the SDGs to the community via the library association programs.
- How
  - Appoint a group of members to be SDG spokespersons - train and arrange for a speaking slot at every librarianship-related events in Indonesia.
  - Get members to promote extensively about SDGs.
  - Share information about SDG in library's public places, library's social media and website - backdrop, infographics, webinars.

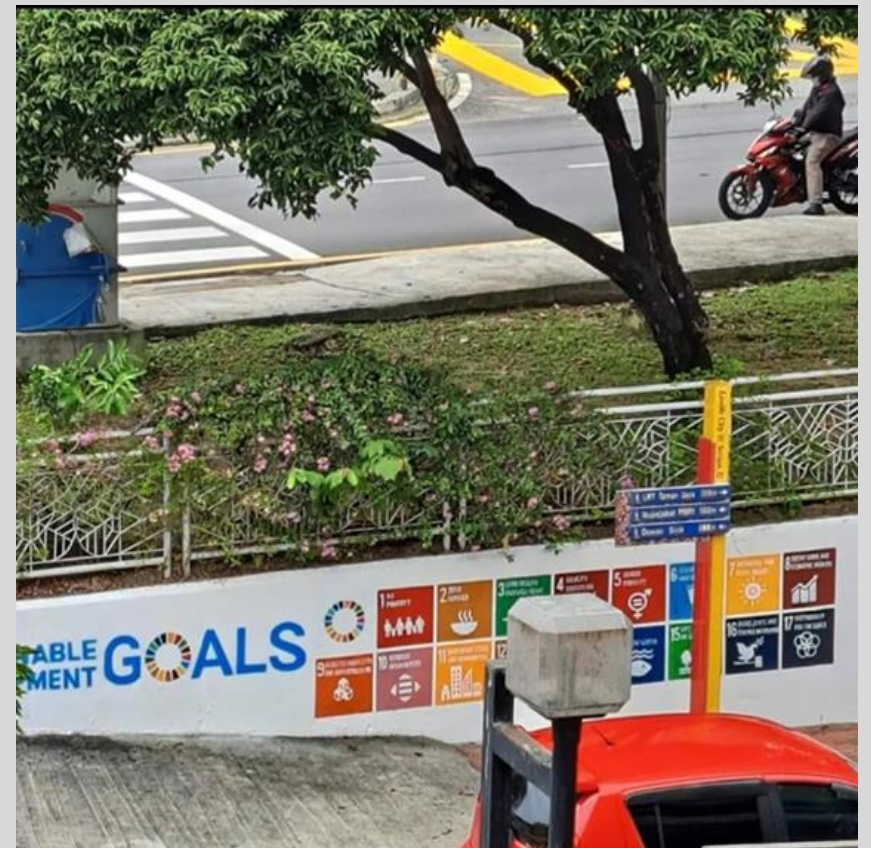

# How to integrate?

- Ensure national library statistics reported in IFLA Library Map of the World.
  - Established in 2017 with data on all type of libraries from 134 countries.
  - a source of basic library statistics .
  - a tool that provides country-level data and a worldwide comparison of different library performance metrics by region.
  - an information-sharing and advocacy tool for libraries around the world.
- Ensure all SDG-related library activities are documented in IFLA SDG Stories
  - In support of UN SDGs.
  - Libraries highlight stories demonstrating the impact of library initiatives aligned with the SDGs.

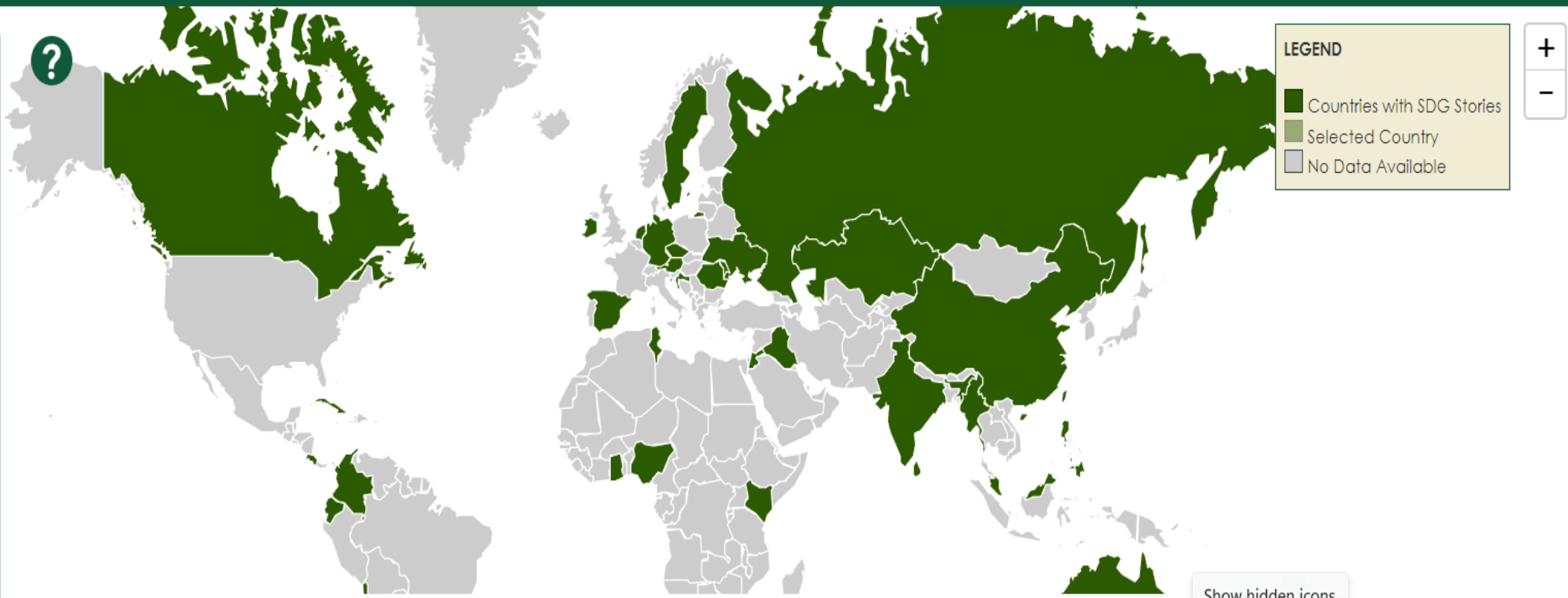
