


Online International Seminars and Collaborations by SLA Asia

Book Exchange: Leave a Book - Take a Book!: An initiative by Central Library, IISER Bhopal Dr. Sandeep Kumar Pathak





I had a great experience when I was associated as administrative support to the Joint Admission Committee (JAC) 2019, also as an editor-in-charge of institute annual report and various other manuals & publications. I was also felicitated by a non-profit library association of Madhya Pradesh known as All Librarians Development Welfare Association (ALAMP), received an award as 'Emerging Archivist' by Dr. Dharam Veer Singh, University Librarian, Delhi University in 2018. During the Covid-19 lockdown, I was an active counsellor of IGNOU for BLISc and MLISc students. I encouraged the use of the National Digital Library of India and many other open access resources made accessible during the lockdown period through various renowned publishers.

An analytical study of Webinars during COVID 19 period on Library & Information Science in India

During the COVID 19 period, when the physical interactions through conferences, workshops and seminars were not possible, the alternative way of meeting and interaction in the field of library and information science resulted in about 347 webinars conducted from April to June 2020. It was when the country was under total lockdown, and later with the partial lockdown. The study shows some significant factors in the field of Library and Information Science.

During this period, the maximum webinars were conducted through the zoom platform out of 347, 195 were conducted through Zoom Platform, 71 were conducted through WebEx, 31 were directly made live through YouTube, 23 through GotoWebinar, and 19 through Google Meet and the remaining six on Face book and two on Demio. So, Zoom was the most popular platform in the lockdown period for conducting the webinars. It was analysed that most of the webinars have been conducted in the morning hours after 12:00 Noon. Out of 321 webinars timings available, 179 were conducted after 12:00 Noon, and the remaining 142 were conducted before 12:00 Noon.

Out of the 347 webinars, the duration of 130 was one hour, 102 webinars were having a time duration of between one to two hours. Eighty-eight webinars were of 2-hour duration, and 13 were having a duration between 2 to 3 hours, while the remaining 14 were of more than 3 hours. Out of 347 seminars, 34 were international webinars, and the remaining 313 were national webinars conducted during the COVID 19 period.

The topics also included the web environment, online environment, and digital aspects were of significant concern. The words like Pandemic, Scenario, Changing, COVID, Post, Next showed that most webinars were concerned with the upcoming future and trends of libraries



Human Resource Management in Libraries in the ICT Environment Dr. Kalyan K. Bhattacharjee and Dr. Nabi Hasan

It is believed that of all the resources available to any developmental process, human resources are the most vital and valuable ones that effectively utilize all the other resources. In the context of Library or Information Centres (LICs), the staff is referred to as 'manpower' or 'human resource' and the most vital source to run the library services. Manpower is the primary workforce within the organisation. When this workforce is used for performing creative and potential tasks to obtain the primary objectives of the organisation, then it is called 'human resource'. To obtain and retain the human resource of an organisation, is called 'Human Resource Management' (HRM).

HRM is a function, performed in organisations that facilitates the most effective use of employees to achieve organisational and individual goals. Two key concepts underlie modern HRM are; Employees as human resources, human capital or organisational assets and HRM as a long-term, integrative and accountable strategic process

HRM deals with the effective and efficient management of an organization's employees. All HRM functions must link to each other and to the organization's goals and strategies. HRM comprises of several activities that include: equal employment opportunity programmes, task analysis, human resource planning, employee recruitment, selection and orientation, career development and counselling, performance evaluation, training and development, compensation and benefits, safety and health, labour relations, discipline, control, and evaluation of personnel function, work scheduling, quality of work, etc.

Human Resource Planning (HRP) is another aspect of HRM which aims to ensure that organisational objectives are achieved by getting the right quantity, quality and skills mix of employees at the right time.

With the above background, the article discusses the HRM in Libraries, explores the basic purpose of HRM in the Libraries, which is to add quality library professionals, create of knowledgebase and of course to contribute to organisational excellence. LICs as they are today, are not-for-profit organisations and are in the group known as service sectors. This is one of the biggest constraints that these information institutions are to cope up with many issues at present including policy and staffing (selection, recruitment, training & development, appraisal), classification of library personnel, staff manual, outsourcing, etc.

To understand the HRM in Libraries, it is necessary to understand the structure of library staff, salary structure, selection process of library staff, questions that may be asked during test/interview, and also the job analysis which also includes job evaluation, its advantage, and disadvantages.

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The Library Committee or Advisory Committee for the Library also plays a vital role in HR Management in the Libraries for important decisions.

Another important component related to HRM is Human Resource Development (HRD) which is basically a process of helping employees in an organisation to acquire competencies. This help is given to employees in a planned and continuous way to acquire and sharpen capabilities required to perform various tasks associated with their recent and expected future roles, develop their general capabilities and discover and exploit their inner potential for their own and/or organisational developmental purposes. Special emphasis is given to the aspect of HRD in Indian Libraries.

The change in the library resources, services, products and also the change as how the user is approaching the information has brought a lot of transition from the Custodian Role of the Librarian to the role of a Knowledge Worker. Due to the enormous penetration of technology, many professions are going through a sea change. The library profession is not an exception to this. Currently, this profession carries about 80% technology component and 20% traditional librarianship.

Keeping the above important points in mind, we can sum up that there are hardly specialized officers for HRD in any library and information centres and human resource aspects are handled, by and large, by the parent organisation to which the LICs are attached. The Library Administrative Departments deal with personnel, mostly in relation to salary and allowances, discipline and control, training and deputation to conferences, performance appraisal in a limited way, and a few others With the growing and changing patterns of information; management plans and formulation of policies exclusively for libraries and information centres relevant to the new conditions seems to be a necessity. The ICT applications, funds crunch, volume and variety of information; increasing demand for information and emphasis on quality, etc. are driving libraries and information centres to restructure their management strategies for human resource planning and development. The LICs may improve the HRM aspects by establishing result-oriented recruitment procedure; giving orientation to the newly recruited staff properly, enhancing the staff skills through appropriate in-service training; evaluating the results after regular intervals, estimating the requirements of human resources for the libraries and information centres for the present as well as the future.
